

### ENERGY STAR Single-Family New Homes Applicable Program Requirements, Versions, and Revisions by Location (Rev. 13)

This document, available at <a href="www.energystar.gov/newhomesrequirements">www.energystar.gov/newhomesrequirements</a>, is designed to be used in conjunction with the Single-Family New Homes (SFNH) national and regional program requirements documents. Use Exhibit 1 or, for California, Exhibit 2 to determine the applicable SFNH program requirements, including the minimum Version and Revision, to which a home is eligible to be certified. For information about the minimum program versions eligible to satisfy the Section 45L New Energy Efficient Home Credit, visit <a href="www.energystar.gov/taxcredits">www.energystar.gov/taxcredits</a>.

A home may only be certified to the SFNH program requirements applicable to the location of the home, as listed in the Exhibits below. For locations where both national and regional program requirements have been listed, a home may be certified to either one.

Where EPA has defined a newer Version and / or Revision of the same ENERGY STAR program requirements, homes are eligible to be certified to the new Version / Revision. For example, if a home is eligible to be certified to Version 3.1 of the SFNH National Program Requirements, then it is also eligible to be certified to Version 3.2 of the SFNH National Program Requirements.

Exhibit 1 and 2 contain all Versions and Revisions eligible for use for homes permitted on or after January 1, 2022. Program requirements applicable prior to this date can be found in the <u>Archives</u>.

#### Footnotes:

- 1. The 'permit date' is the date on which the permit authorizing construction of the building was issued. Alternatively, the date of the Rater's first site visit or the date of the contract on the home is allowed to be used as the 'permit date'. The permit application date is not allowed to be used.
- 2. The term 'Rater' refers to the person(s) completing the third-party verification required for certification. The person(s) shall: a) be a Certified Rater or Approved Inspector, as defined by ANSI / RESNET / ICC 301, or an equivalent designation as determined by an HCO; and, b) have attended and successfully completed an EPA-recognized training class. See <a href="https://www.energystar.gov/newhomestraining">www.energystar.gov/newhomestraining</a>.
- 3. The 'plan approval date' is the date that a jurisdiction approves a home plan and its efficiency features for use on a specific lot or tract. As an exception, if a new plan is added to a specific tract's existing plan set and the new plan is subject to the same version of the energy code as the existing plan set, then the 'plan approval date' is considered to be the existing plan set's original plan approval date.
